Our students and staff welcomed new faculty this school year!



Modeling Christ-Like Character

Our core values at CCS are: Academic Excellence, Biblical Integration, and Christ-like Character. During this school year, our students are focusing on Romans 12 as they explore and encounter a truer understanding of what it means to be image-bearers of Christ. Romans 12 calls out specific actions for us to emulate, and students are being challenged to consider how they reflect those actions in their walk.

"... offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God..." Students at upper school retreat meditated on this, considering how their current lifestyle reflects this, and what practical things they could implement if this is an area of struggle for them.

"... do not think of yourself more highly than you ought... We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us." Across all grade levels, students are encouraged to celebrate the successes of their peers, not being jealous or begrudging of each other. They are given opportunities to explore their own gifts through activities like Speech Meet, drama, music, Chapel Worship, athletics, and art. Project-driven curriculum such as National History Day encourages students to explore creative mediums while honing their research and critical thinking skills. God has truly blessed CCS with an incredibly talented student body!
