Purpose of Summer Reading:

The purpose of summer reading is to promote familiarity with influential authors and masterpieces of literature and to encourage reading skills and comprehension over the summer and into the new school year.

Note:

Students are responsible for finding a copy of the book at their local library, bookstore, etc. Just make sure you are getting the actual book and not a shortened version or children's copy.

Instructions:

1. Read ***20,000 Leagues Under The Sea*** by Jules Verne. A test on this book will be given during the first few days of school. Bring your copy of the book to school as we will be discussing it further during the first week or so of classes.
2. Read **ONE** of the following novels and **write an essay**, with a minimum of 400 words, about a specific theme that you saw in your book displayed in either the plot or one of the characters. The **essay is due on the first day of class** in the fall. (This essay is worth 20 points)
 - *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer (or Huckleberry Finn)* by Mark Twain
 - *Anne of Green Gables* by L.M. Montgomery
 - *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis (or any of the 7 Narnia books you have not read)
